

Now in each and every title of a work of art has a definite insight into the theme of the work in some way. So the title of a 'Tale of a Tub' is very suggestive and apt. The title is the product of a fusion of two elements. There are three elements in this title. The phrase "a tale of a tub" was frequently used in the literature of the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries in the sense of a dull, cock and dull story or foolish story that no one would believe. In this 'tale of a father and his three sons' it not to be taken as a true story. It has an allegorical significance.

The main aim of writing this book was to satirise the presbyterians and dissenters who were very prominent at that time where Swift was an Anglican priest. In his time the word 'tub' stood for 'Dissenting preachers'. Pulpit or 'A Tale of a Tub' was to be story describing the absurdities of the dissenting preachers and their ideas. He also took an idea from the practice of seamen in dealing with whales. As he says, "seamen have a custom when they meet a whale, to fling him out on ainity tub, by way of amusement, to divert him from laying 'hot violent hands upon the ship.' The ship in this case was the state and the established church of England. The whale was Hobbes Leviathan which had given dangerous ideas to the wits. Swift wanted to write a book, which would keep the wits busy in the controversies regarding the abuses of religion and learning, thus preventing them from doing harm to the church and the state.

In this way we find that the main aim of Swift behind writing this comic tale is to correct the corrupt practices of the church. Seventeenth century was full of strange religious controversies which created much intellectual stir, and several new projects and plans were made. Here the novelist has made fun of the Christian ideals of the church. Everyone

to you the Christian masters with great respect. Swift makes fun of them by saying that you used to regale people so you will a kick and break his heart and not be used or practice that the people and their wives were only safe because of his stiffness. Swift also ridicules when his one character naming Jack Treats the wife as meat, drink and cloth and a universal medicine. Religion or atheism was a product of sexual excitement. The prophets should be more men.

In this way we find that Swift has written this tale to convert the corrupt practices of the church as well as amuse the readers. The tale which Swift narrates is the tub and it tends to keep off the whale from the ship of the Commonwealth. As the tub causes to engage the whale on the ship and not to distract it the tale is written to engage the attention of the public far from the corrupt practices of the church.

Thus the title of the novel is very apt, just and appropriate.

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Herbaceous, banished and exalted Slipping up on the imagination of what is highest and best, becomes over-shot, and spent, and weary, and suddenly falls like a dead bird of paradise to the ground."

Despite all our love of darkness the new verbal irony, allegory, fable and other such oblique stylistic devices satirise the society. The entire work in itself works out allegory of the three brothers again A Tale of a Tub the best way Swift finds of letting the world that he regards the poor to be writers and little-known His piece is a reaction upon the crude and emotional state of Bonne's time his intention is to follow the path of common sense and not that of fancy. This way of writing is not decorated by sparkling conceits. The clarity of Swift's prose style is characterised by irony, satire and by his sound wisdom. Swift is deeply interested in the values of good like Bernard Shaw. Thus his style is characterised by simplicity, consuming intensity of irony, masculinity and reason.

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
